Purpose of the Fund

To provide annual scholarships to graduating Merrill High School seniors intending to pursue a field of study relating to veterinary medicine (1st choice) or nursing (2nd choice).

Applications and Eligibility

Merrill High School seniors can apply for this scholarship through the school's general scholarship application process. Candidates for this scholarship must meet the following requirements:

- Graduating high school senior from Merrill Senior High School;
- Planning to pursue a field of study relating to veterinary services (first choice) or nursing (second choice);
- Accepted for enrollment in an accredited technical school or college.

Selection Guidelines

The following qualities will be taken into consideration in the selection process:

- Record of involvement in high school and/or community activities;
- A 3.25 GPA or higher.

Selection Process

The Merrill Senior High School Scholarship Selection Committee is designated as the selection committee to name this scholarship recipient. The committee will consist of:

- A representative of the Streich Family
- High school Ag teacher
- A representative of the Merrill Community Foundation

The Community Foundation of North Central Wisconsin will monitor the selection process.

Members of the immediate families of any of the Selection Committee members shall be eligible to apply with the provision that the related member not_serve on the committee during the year in which the application is considered.

Notification and Payment

The recipient will be named at the Senior Awards Ceremony. The Community Foundation of North Central Wisconsin will confirm the selection of the committee with the recipient after the ceremony. Scholarship funds will be paid directly to the college or university the student plans to attend, after the student has provided proof of registration to the Community Foundation office. Payment will be made in two \$750 installments toward the student's first two semesters of study.
