### PURPOSE

1) To assist Pukall Lumber Company employee's dependent children with the cost of post-secondary education, 2) as well as to make scholarships available to Lakeland Union High School graduates who plan to enroll in a Wood Technology or Wood Science Program at an accredited technical school.

**APPLICATION DEADLINE:** March 15

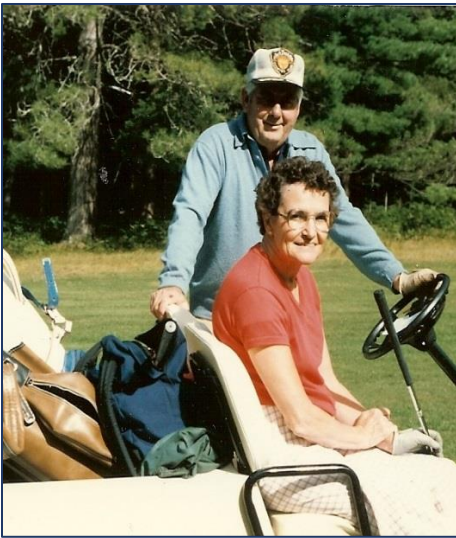
### YOUR APPLICATION MUST INCLUDE:

- Transcript of most recent grades
- List of extracurricular activities and employment (downloadable form online)
- At least one reference letter from a teacher, community leader, or employer

### CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

- 1) Candidates for this scholarship must meet the following requirements:
  - Parent must be employed by Pukall Lumber Company (student must be a dependent child)
  - Demonstrate financial need
  - Demonstrate a solid work ethic
  - Accepted at an accredited college, university, technical school, or certificate program in any field of study
  - Although academic achievement is not a qualification for the award, the student should have maintained at least a 2.0 GPA in the last two semesters of study
- 2) In 2018, the Pukall family initiated a second scholarship to be awarded to:
  - A graduating Lakeland Union High School senior / or recent LUHS graduate
  - Planning to enroll / or currently enrolled in the Wood Technology or Wood Science Program (most likely at NTC in Antigo)

In both selection processes, weight will be placed on demonstration of a solid work ethic, through participation in activities in school and the community, including work.

### **ANNOUNCEMENT**

The recipients will be announced at their schools' scholarship awards ceremonies if appropriate. Announcement will also be made through the company's communication methods.

### **PAYMENT OF THE SCHOLARSHIP**

The recipient/s will receive a congratulatory letter from the Community Foundation after the announcement has been made, instructing them on how to receive their scholarship funding.

The student must provide proof of registration to the Community Foundation office for payment to be initiated. The Foundation will make payment directly to the post-secondary school the student is attending.

The recipients are asked to acknowledge the scholarship by sending a thank you note to the donors through the Community Foundation office or directly to the Pukall Lumber Foundation.
