The Mid Wisconsin Foundation Legacy Fund was established within the Community Foundation of North Central Wisconsin when the Mid Wisconsin Foundation was dissolved in 2013 as a result of the bank's merger with Nicolet Bank.

An advisory committee reviews applications and makes recommendations to the board of directors of the Community Foundation regarding grant distribution annually.

Only requests for specifically identified items or programs will be considered.

### WHAT WE DO NOT FUND:

- Political or strictly religious purposes
- Churches, schools, or political groups
- Individuals
- Organizations that recieve state or federal funding

Applications will not be accepted from organizations that have recieved a grant in the previous year.
