



CAROL VERHASSELT MEMORIAL ART SCHOLARSHIP

PURPOSE

The Carol Verhassel Legacy Fund annually awards a scholarship to a student of the greater Wausau area (DCE, Newman, Wausau East or Wausau West) who wishes to pursue a post-secondary education in the field of art.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Apply online by visiting www.cfoncw.org. Click on "Grants & Scholarships" / "Scholarships" / "Apply Online Now" to reach the online application portal and begin the registration and application process. If this is your first visit to the site, you will need to "Create an Account." If this is a return visit, enter your email address and password. Choose the appropriate application from the menu.

APPLICATION DEADLINE: February 15

YOUR APPLICATION MUST INCLUDE:

- Transcript of most recent grades
- List of extracurricular activities (downloadable form online)
- Two reference letters (from a teacher, counselor, employer, or community member)

CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

- Graduating high school senior from the greater Wausau area (including DC Everest, Newman Catholic, Wausau East, and Wausau West High Schools)
- With a driving passion for the arts
- Intending to pursue a degree in the arts at an accredited college or university within six months of graduation
- With a drive and compassion for life and people
- Demonstrating financial need

ANNOUNCEMENT

The recipient will be announced at their high school senior awards ceremony in the spring.

PAYMENT OF THE SCHOLARSHIP

The recipient will receive a congratulatory letter from the Community Foundation after the awards ceremony, instructing them on how to receive their scholarship funding. The student must provide proof of registration to the Community Foundation office for payment to be initiated. The Foundation will make payment directly to the college or university the student is attending.

In her retirement, Carol enjoyed giving back to her community. She spent many hours volunteering with Aspirus Comfort Care and Hospice Services at the Hospice House, and Aspirus Hospital.
