PURPOSE

To provide scholarships up to \$3,000, for students whose parents or guardians are employed by Rocket Industrial, Inc. to pursue undergraduate studies at any accredited college, university, or technical school in any field of study.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Apply online by visiting www.cfncw.org. Click on "Grants & Scholarships" / "Scholarships" / "Apply Online Now" to reach the online application portal and begin the registration and application process. If this is your first visit to the site, you will need to "Create an Account." If this is a return visit, enter your email address and password. Choose the Rocket Industrial Scholarship application from the menu.

APPLICATION DEADLINE MARCH 1

YOUR APPLICATION MUST INCLUDE

- Most recent transcript of grades
- List of extracurricular activities
- Two current reference letters

CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

To be considered for this scholarship, the student must:

- Be the son, daughter, or legally adopted child of a Rocket Industrial employee that has been employed with the company for at least one year as of March 1
- Age 25 years or younger
- Enrolled in undergraduate studies offered through an accredited college, university, or technical college in the current school year
- Currently carrying a 3.0 GPA or greater

ANNOUNCEMENT

The recipients will be announced through the company employee notification methods. High school seniors will be recognized at their senior awards ceremony if appropriate.

PAYMENT OF THE SCHOLARSHIP

The recipient will receive a congratulatory letter from the Community Foundation instructing them on how to receive their scholarship funding.

The student must provide proof of registration (a class schedule for the 2nd semester or tuition bill), and a transcript of grades for 1st semester to the Community Foundation office for payment to be initiated. The Foundation will make payment directly to the college, university, or technical college the student is attending toward their second semester studies.
