She is a member of the National Association of Teachers of Singing. Certified as a Master Cantor, Barbara has attended the Liturgical Music Workshop at St. John's University in Collegeville, Minnesota. Barbara was the featured soloist in the Vaughan Williams Five Mystical Songs with organ and choir; soprano soloist in the Schubert Mass in G performed with orchestra; and performed alto and soprano solos in Messiah.

BARBARA A. LATTIMER SCHOLARSHIP

PURPOSE

To annually award a scholarship to a student who has taken vocal study at the Wausau Conservatory of Music. The student must plan to major in vocal performance or musical theater, or plan to be a member of the vocal choir, at an accredited college or university.

APPLICATION AND SELECTION PROCESS

Students must submit their application to the WCM office by the close of business on the 2nd Friday in March. The recipient of the scholarship will be selected through a competitive audition in the spring of each year. The competition date will be determined and announced by the WCM.

ELIGIBILITY

- · A current student in voice at the Wausau Conservatory of Music;
- · Must have studied at least two (2) semesters of voice at the WCM at the time of the competition – including the current semester;
- · Student must have the approval of current voice teacher to participate:
- · Applicant must plan to attend an accredited college or university within six (6) months of the competition;
- · Must intend to study private voice for at least two consecutive semesters in college or be a member of the college's vocal choir for two consecutive semesters.

COMPETITION RULES

- · Submit completed application to the WCM office by the close of business on the second Friday of March.
- Each student will be allowed 15 minutes to perform.
- · There will be one impartial judge who is not a member of the faculty of the WCM.
- · Required repertoire will include three (3) memorized pieces which best display the singer's vocal talent. The solo ensemble list or the Thurow suggested list are good resources.
- · The student will pick one song and the judge will pick a second from the remaining two songs. The performing order will be determined by the singer.
- The pieces must be accompanied by piano. WCM will provide an accompanist free of charge for the audition if requested. Any accompanist fees for rehearsal are the participant's responsibility.

ANNOUNCEMENT

The recipients will be announced at the WCM Recognition Concert.

PAYMENT OF THE SCHOLARSHIP

The student must provide proof of second semester registration and a transcript of their first semester grades (maintaining a 2.0 GPA or greater) to the Community Foundation office for payment to be initiated. The Foundation will make payment directly to the college or university the student is attending.
