



MACDONALD FOUNDATION WORK ETHIC SCHOLARSHIP

PURPOSE

To recognize students from Marathon County and the Merrill area, who have demonstrated a strong work ethic and plan to attend any four-year college within the University of Wisconsin system. High school graduating seniors, as well as current college students, are eligible to apply. Whether chosen to receive the scholarship or not, students are eligible to reapply in successive years.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Apply online by visiting our website at cfoncw.org. Click on "Grants & Scholarships" / "Scholarships" / "Apply Online Now" to reach the online application portal and begin the registration and application process. If this is your first visit to the site, you will need to "Create an Account." If this is a return visit, enter your email address and password. Choose the appropriate application from the menu.

APPLICATION PROCESS: March 1

YOUR APPLICATION MUST INCLUDE:

- Transcript of most recent grades
- List of extracurricular activities
- Two reference letters – one from an employer

CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

- High school graduating senior or student currently enrolled in college
- From the Merrill area or Marathon County, Wisconsin
- Planning to pursue a post-secondary education in any field of study, at a four-year campus within the University of Wisconsin system
- Demonstrating a strong work ethic and community involvement

The following qualities will be taken into consideration in the selection process:

- A strong work ethic – including demonstration of employment
- Community service and extracurricular involvement
- Financial need and special circumstances will be taken into consideration, but will generally not be a deciding factor

ANNOUNCEMENT

High school recipients will be announced at their senior awards ceremony; college students will receive notification after the selection has taken place.

PAYMENT OF THE SCHOLARSHIP

The recipient will receive a congratulatory letter from the Community Foundation instructing them on how to receive their scholarship funding. The student must provide proof of registration to the Community Foundation office for payment to be initiated. The Foundation will make payment directly to the college or university the student is attending.
