#### **PURPOSE**

To award scholarships to able and deserving minority women from the greater Wausau area based on scholastic ability, personal integrity, and evidence of a desire to better the community. High school graduating seniors and currently enrolled college students are eligible to apply.

- Transcript of most recent grades
- · List of excurricular activities (downloadable form online)
- One reference letter

# **CRITERIA FOR SELECTION**

- Hmong woman from the greater Wausau area
- Embraces the Hmong culture and acts as a positive role model for younger girls
- Exhibits character, motivation, and/or experience in overcoming obstacles
- Displays a desire to better the community
- Carrying a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or greater
- Plans to enroll as a full-time student and work toward an associate, bachelor, or masters degree in the upcoming school year

# **ANNOUNCMENT**

The recipient will be announced at their high school senior awards ceremony in the spring if appropriate.

# **PAYMENT OF SCHOLARSHIP**

The recipient will receive a congratulatory letter from the Community Foundation after the awards ceremony, instructing them on how to receive their scholarship funding. The student must provide proof of registration to the Community Foundation office for payment to be initiated. The Foundation will make payment directly to the college or university the student is attending.
