

# APPLICATION PROCEDURE AND GUIDELINES



The Merrill Community Foundation meets quarterly to conduct business and review grant proposals from nonprofit organizations wishing to join in fulfilling its mission of supporting local organizations that seek to enrich the Merrill area community now and into the future.

The Merrill Community Foundation represents a significant financial commitment by many individuals and businesses in the Merrill area towards the community’s enrichment, so the Board is interested in reviewing a wide array of projects in areas as diverse as the arts, education, economic development, health, social services, and the preservation of historical and cultural resources. All applications are evaluated with consideration to the policies, funding objectives, and mission of the Foundation.

Grant seekers are encouraged to discuss their ideas with a Foundation board member regarding their project ideas before submitting an electronic application (contact information below). Application Deadline: Electronic applications must be submitted by 5 p.m. on the first business day in the months of **January, April, July, and October** to be considered in that grant cycle.
