FUND BACKSTORY . . .

The Medical Education/Library Fund was established within the Community Foundation of North Central Wisconsin on December 18, 1995, to support continuing medical education and access to resources for the healthcare community. Initially, the fund was created to provide educational opportunities for members of the Wausau Hospital medical staff and other individuals designated by the Wausau Hospital Medical Executive Committee, as well as to maintain and enhance the hospital's medical library.



Recognizing the importance of fostering the next generation of healthcare professionals, representatives of the fund recommended a change in purpose in 2012. With the approval of the Community Foundation's Board of Directors, the fund was redirected to support scholarships for graduating high school seniors from Marathon County who plan to pursue careers in the medical field.

Through this evolution, the fund continues to honor its original mission—to strengthen healthcare in the region—by investing in the education of future medical professionals. The Medical Education/Library Fund remains a lasting testament to the community's commitment to learning, service, and the advancement of medicine in North Central Wisconsin.
