## FUND BACKSTORY . . .

The OjO-Dor Scholarship Fund carries forward the vision and generosity of Oscar John Dorwin, a man whose life reflected a deep appreciation for education and a lasting affection for his hometown of Minocqua, Wisconsin.

In 1966, Mr. Dorwin established the OjO-Dor Foundation, Inc. in Greenwich, Connecticut, with a clear and heartfelt purpose — to help students from the Lakeland School District who demonstrated both academic promise and financial need pursue post-secondary education. Through this act of philanthropy, he sought to open doors of opportunity for young people, honoring the community that helped shape his early life and success.

In 1991, the assets of the OjO-Dor Foundation were transferred to the Wausau Area Community Foundation (now known as the Community Foundation of North Central Wisconsin) to ensure the sustainability of Mr. Dorwin's charitable mission. Through the creation of the OjO-Dor Scholarship Fund, his legacy continues to enrich lives and inspire achievement.

Today, the fund provides educational scholarships to outstanding graduates of the Lakeland School District in Minocqua, enabling them to pursue their academic and professional goals. Each scholarship awarded stands as a testament to Oscar John Dorwin's enduring belief in the power of education and his lifelong commitment to helping future generations realize their potential.
